CNGA1-PRA and other inherited eye diseases in the Shetland Sheepdog

OptiGen, a veterinary diagnostic laboratory specializing in DNA testing of inherited diseases in dogs, has recently added a test for Progressive Retinal Atrophy (PRA) in Shelties. Similar to the CEA/CH DNA test that OptiGen has provided for Shelties for many years, the CNGA1-PRA test is able to detect whether the dog carries 0, 1 or 2 copies of the mutation. Also similar to CEA/CH, CNGA1-PRA is inherited in an autosomal recessive manner, meaning that carriers of only one copy of the mutation will not develop the disease however they can pass the mutation on to their offspring. A rule of thumb in breeding should be to ensure that *at least* one parent of a litter is Normal/Clear of the mutation. This will ensure that none of the pups develop this form of PRA--which is typically first detected in routine eye exams when the dogs are 3-5 years of age.

Although the CNGA1 DNA test is very useful, it should be viewed as a tool that is complementary to regular eye exams performed by board certified veterinary ophthalmologists. These clinical examinations are where a variety of other diseases may be observed, including other forms of PRA that remain uncharacterized and have no DNA test yet available. As is the case in many breeds for which DNA tests for PRA are available, we now know that at least one other type of PRA occurs in the Shetland Sheepdog. OptiGen supports an ongoing research program aimed at identifying new mutations that cause PRA (and other important inherited eye diseases, e.g. day blindness, cataracts and canine multifocal retinopathy). As part of this research program, OptiGen accepts blood samples from pedigreed dogs that have been diagnosed as having PRA by a board certified ophthalmologist. Through this program we are able to determine whether multiple forms of PRA are occurring in a breed as well as to include the samples in our search for new mutations. The CNGA1-PRA mutation was described by a Scandinavian research group² and it appears that the mutation may be more common in Shelties from that region compared to those from North America however the sample size of CNGA1-PRA tested dogs at this time is too low to allow for conclusive estimates of frequency.
